The screening of the film coincides with the 11th session of the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues, at the United Nations Headquarters. Following the film there will be a Q&A and informational briefing on the current situation in Hawaii. The event is open to the public and is free of charge. Refreshments will be served.

About the film...

Hawaii – A Voice for Sovereignty is an award-winning documentary film by photojournalist Catherine Bauknight that explores the culture of the Native Hawaiians and their connection to the land. At the forefront of the film are social, economic, and ecological issues that have developed in Hawaii since the takeover by the U.S. in 1893, revealed in interviews with grassroots indigenous people, scholars and authors. The documentary's goal is to raise awareness of the issues faced by the Hawaiian People, which threatens their ancient and environmentally sustainable culture. Bauknight hopes this film will help to bring about awareness and remedies for the injustices suffered by the Hawaiian People.
